Brother's Corner

In the Gospel this week, Jesus announces that He has come to enact judgment on the "ruler of this world." Who is this ruler that Jesus has come to drive out? We can discern from other parts of Scripture that it must be God's great Enemy, the Evil One who has become consumed with envy of God's power and decided to attempt to claim it for himself. Satan has deceived the human race into turning against God, and joining him in rebellion, and therefore he arrogantly claims us as his own, and declares himself the Lord of this world. Although he claims things that are not his, the devil does wield real power over us; St. Paul goes so far as to call him "the god of this world" (2 Corinthians 4:4).

But, if there's one thing that God makes clear in His revelation to the Jewish people, it's that there is only one Lord of all things, only one God worthy of the name. Now, in Jesus, we see that God is not willing to allow Satan's false kingship to last, but that He Himself has come to establish His own Kingdom on earth.

However, the power of the true King is not like that of the usurper. His assault on the powers of darkness is something against which they had prepared no defense, as it was something they would never have even conceived of. As Jesus says in this same Gospel: "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." Thus Jesus makes Himself weak, poor, and vulnerable, and Satan practically trips all over himself as he rushes to humiliate and destroy God's Anointed One. He takes the bait, and the trap is sprung. The Prince of Death has swallowed something he cannot digest, and his power is broken by the divine life within Jesus.

This path, the Way of the Cross, is the only one which Jesus has offered to us who hope for salvation in Him. It is the only one which He Himself has walked, and if we follow Him, there is nowhere to go but Calvary: "Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there also will my servant be."

Of course, that is a great statement of hope, as we realize when we think of Jesus reigning at His Father's right hand, triumphant over all His enemies – even death itself. But that comes later. For now, we are in the desert with Christ, or laboring behind Him under the Cross, on the way to death. Our task for now is to bear that Cross with Him, like Him, out of love for Him. It is at the end of this path, and only this path, that true life awaits us.





Adult Confirmation Spring 2024

Each year, Bishop Soto extends an opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation to practicing adult Catholics of the Diocese of Sacramento who are baptized, have received First Communion, and have received religious instruction since their First Communion, but for various reasons were never received the Sacrament of Confirmation.



The next celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation is scheduled for Saturday, May 18, 2024, at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament, Sacramento. 5:00 p.m. Candidates will be prepared at the parish level by completing 8 sessions held over a series of consecutive Sundays from March 10, 2024 through May 5, 2024, 3:00-4:30 p.m., St. Dominic's Ministry Center, Siena Rm.

Sacrament preparation will include prayer, scripture and a review of the Catechism of the Catholic Church. To participate the candidate must be a baptized Catholic, who has received catechetical instruction at least up to receiving the Eucharist (First Communion), be either unmarried or in a marriage recognized as valid by the Catholic Church, and have a recent copy of their Baptismal Certificate certified within the past 6 months. Confirmation candidates must select a Sponsor who must be Catholic, received the Sacrament of Confirmation, is a practicing Catholic, and is at least 16 years of age.

Organ music for 7:30 and 11:00 a.m. Masses

Prelude: Lament by Henry Purcell

Henry Purcell (1659-1695) was an important English composer of Baroque music. His most important positions were organist at the Chapel Royal and Westminster Abbey. Though originally written for Dido and Aeneas, Lament features characteristic church music style of Purcell's time - passacaglia variations with a repeated bass line important positions were organist at the Chapel - passacaglia variations with a repeated bass line and melody emphasizing lament and repentance.

Postlude: I ask not worldly wealth by J. S. Bach This is one of 'chorale' arrangements by J. S. Bach - traditional German chant melodies which Bach arranged with great skill in voice leading. Different instrumental options are possible, in this case arranged for organ by Frank Asper.
