Pastor's Corner



This past week, we celebrated the Memorial of the Holy Guardian Angels. In Matthew 18, when Jesus' disciples ask him who is the greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus responds by placing a child in their midst and says, "Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the

Kingdom of heaven. Whoever humbles himself like this child is the greatest in the Kingdom of heaven." A key truth that is implicit to this response from Jesus is that unless the disciples humble themselves like the little children in their communities who had no worldly status, they would not have the humility they needed to properly cooperate with the grace God was offering them to be truly lifted up to Heavenly greatness through the power of God's grace. Jesus then makes a statement about the true preciousness of these lowstatus little ones. "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven always look upon the face of my heavenly Father." When preaching on this subject for our school kids, I likened the Holy Guardian Angels to high-end security professionals - the sort of blacksuited agents we would expect to be guarding the president of the United States through the Secret Service, or the pros guarding 'big shots,' like Elon Musk or Taylor Swift. I pointed out that, from a worldly perspective, while we typically expect such elite security details to be reserved for the rich and famous, God assigns a truly elite security guard for each one of us - our guardian angel. While our guardian angel may at times protect us from earthly dangers, that angel's primary job is to help protect our souls from the influence of the Evil One. I reminded our kids that for this protection to be successful, however, we need to work well with our guardian angels. Those angels can help us, and yet we nevertheless have the free will to invite in the Devil and his goons in spite of the angels' help. Each time we give in to temptation, in a sense, we are basically allowing the Devil or one of his minions to walk smugly past our Heavenly security guard and into the door of our souls. I imagine the child-like humility Jesus calls us to in Matthew 18 can help to prevent this from happening. With humility, it is easier to maintain a humble sense of reliance on God to keep our souls safe, which is bound to help us be less cavalier about succumbing to temptation. Let's all strive to work better with our guardian angels. They really are the 'best in the business.' Their job is to help guide us home to Heaven. If we stick to their protection, won't it be fun reminiscing with them about the journey when we finally get home to the Father?!




Thank You!!!



Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.
