### **Pastor's Corner**



This past Thursday, our nine new novices were clothed in the Dominican habit by Father Christopher Fadok, provincial of the Western Dominican Province at Saint Dominic's Church in San Francisco. The ceremony is called vestition, and it is pretty cool to watch. We always do vestition in that

church, and only the friars are allowed to attend it. Before the young postulants received their Dominican tunic, scapular, capuce, and rosary, Father Christopher gave a homily meant to prepare the new novices-to-be for the year of prayer and discernment they would undergo. Drawing upon imagery from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, Father Christopher reminded the young men that God would be fashioning them to be arrows in his quiver that at the end of formation, he would be shooting out into the world for the destruction of sin and spread of the Gospel. He warned the men that during Dominican formation, and even throughout their lives as religious brothers, God would allow them to endure challenges meant to purify them from sin. This penitential purification of sin would be God's means of polishing them as arrows fit to do battle with Satan. The analogy certainly rang true in my mind and heart. Repeatedly throughout my life as a Dominican, particularly during formation, I had to die to my ego and be willing to leave various comfort zones. It was always difficult, but the payoff came in the form of interior growth that made me smarter and feel stronger, freer, and more loving toward God and others. As I watched each new novice receive his habit last Thursday evening, it struck me how different I had become since the night I received that habit back in the fall of 2011. I would not want to go back in time and relive that evolution, but I am so glad I underwent it. When it was happening, there were times I found myself asking, "This feels so difficult. Should I leave?" But, repeatedly, I opted to stay in formation because I intuited that the process was transforming me into someone better. I believe that intuition was correct. I am so glad for the way my Dominican brothers have helped me develop, even if I did not always appreciate their influence earlier on this journey. It was sort of the way one may not appreciate a sibling during childhood, but in adulthood realizes that sibling was a tremendous gift. Let's all keep those nine new novices in our prayers as they endeavor on their own walks with the Lord through Dominican life!





Notice of Deadline for Filing Claims: October 1, 2024

YOU MAY HAVE A SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM OR OTHER CLAIM AGAINST THE DIOCESE OF SACRAMENTO

On April 1, 2024, The Roman Catholic Bishop of Sacramento aka Diocese of Sacramento filed a chapter 11 bankruptcy petition for protection under title 11 of the United States Code.

If you were sexually abused by any person connected with the Diocese, you must file a claim so as to be received by October 1, 2024, or otherwise you will be forever barred, estopped, and enjoined from asserting such claim against the Diocese.

Claims based on acts or omissions of the Diocese that occurred before April 1, 2024, must be filed on or before October 1, 2024, even if such claims are not now fixed, liquidated, or certain or did not mature or become fixed, liquidated, or certain before April 1, 2024.
