Pastor's Corner



Last Saturday morning before the Benicia Christmas Parade, as I grabbed my coat and stepped out of the office and into the wind and rain, wincing, I said to myself, "Are we really doing this?" Approaching our meeting location in front of the Yacht Club, we found ourselves driving through deep water that had flooded a large section of the street.

I synched up my hood, and we unloaded our wagon full of candy cane bags for the kids and Christmas mass schedule flyers. Many of the folks we had expected to join us understandably canceled, but we did manage to have roughly twenty-five present in our group, including six cheerleaders, which was a relief since they were leading our routine in front of the iudges. As our participants arrived. I went out and scouted for where our group's spot in the queue. This required a bit of extra effort because while we had an assigned parade group-number, several groups who were scheduled to be in the parade opted to stay home. This meant those of us who did walk had to do our best to compare assigned group-numbers to figure out where we belonged in the queue with some numbers missing. Once that was sorted, I rejoined our party to find one of our cheer moms with her own wagon containing thermoses of hot chocolate and a waterproof sound system for the cheer routine. This mom got out her phone and, using a Bluetooth connection to the sound system, played Christmas music for us to enjoy. As we waited to enter the parade's queue, the light rain fell, the gusty wind blew, Nat King Cole sang of "chestnuts roasting on an open fire," and I put on my Santa hat, finding that the whole experience was turning magical. Soon after, the parade began, and we marched toward the entry point. Right before we stepped into the line, I gathered the group together for a prayer and reminded our kids that, as Christians, we were called to follow Jesus come rain or shine. The cheerleaders helped me rev up the participants with a call-and-response cheer we like to do at sports games, and then onto 1st Street we marched! A delightful surprise was that many Benicia folks, including parishioners, did turn up to watch and wave from underneath the storefront overhangs. And within a few minutes, the rain stopped, and the overall vibe lifted even more as parishioners distributed mass flyers to spectators, the kids passed out candy canes, and our sound system blared Mariah Carey's "All I Want for Christmas is You." I certainly have wonderful memories of our march in last year's Christmas parade with our much bigger number of participants and ideal weather. I suspect, however, that this year's parade will prove to have been even more memorable!

Did you know that the first nativity set was created by Francis of Assisi in 1223? Nowadays, you see nativity scenes on Christmas cards, in town centers, at the mall, outside churches, and in homes all across the world. Traditionally a nativity set, also known as a nativity crèche or manger scene, is a set of figures that create the Christmas scene: baby Jesus, Mary, Joseph, the angel, the shepherds, the three kings, and a variety of farm animals. Catholics traditionally hide the baby Jesus and only add him to the scene on Christmas Day. This is a great visual way to help young children understand what we prepare for during Advent.

PILGRIMS OF HOPE

"Since we are justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing in the glory of God... Hope does not disappoint, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us" (Rom 5:1-2.5).

The Catholic Church will celebrate the Year of Jubilee in 2025, a yearlong event that marks the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of the Lord. The year's theme is "Pilgrims of Hope". The Jubilee Year starts on December 24, 2024 with the opening of the Holy Door in Rome. In our Diocese, we will celebrate a special Vigil mass to proclaim the Jubilee Year at the Cathedral on Saturday, December 28, 2024 (The Feast of the Holy Family). The Holy Doors in Rome will close on December 28, 2025 and the Jubilee will formally conclude in Rome on January 6, 2026 (The Solemnity of Epiphany).

PILGRIMAGE

Bishop Soto has designated **12 Pilgrimage Sites** for the Jubilee Year and encourages all Catholics to make a pilgrimage and visit these sites and to reflect and pray upon the three diocesan themes for the Jubilee. Partial and plenary indulgences can be earned for pilgrimage and/or practice.
