Pastor's Corner



This past week, we had a daily mass reading from the Letter to the Hebrews that counsels the following: "Take care, brothers and sisters, that none of you may have an evil and unfaithful heart, so as to forsake the living God. Encourage yourselves daily while it is still 'today,' so that none of

you may grow hardened by the deceit of sin. We have become partners of Christ if only we hold the beginning of the reality firm until the end." Implicit to this warning is that we should keep close watch over our hearts (and minds, for that matter), so that they are not imperiled by the various elements of daily life that can corrode our souls. It is wise for the epistle-writer to advise us to maintain close attention to this because such corrosion can often happen in subtle, gradual ways that escape our notice. For example, as we spend time with coworkers who engage regularly in a toxic form of humor, little-by-little, that tendency can rub off on us, even when we are in other settings with other people, like our friends and family. I remember that happened with me during my early twenties. I had picked up the habit of very caustic banter practiced by some of my coworkers at that point. One evening I was out with my sister, a cousin, and my cousin's friend to whom I offered a retort that was quite unusually glib and harsh for me. The remark caused them to all look up at me quite taken aback with various expressions that seemed to convey a reaction of "ouch." Their reaction proved a valuable alert that my work environment was having a negative effect on my persona that I had not noticed. I was fortunate to get that alert relatively early, which enabled me to work toward making changes similarly early. Some people who allow their environments to change their personalities for the worse do not get the benefit of their friends or family giving them any kind of heads-up. In many such cases, what happens instead is that those friends or family simply distance themselves without offering any explanation for this to the friend or family member who has changed. If we want to avoid this fate, it is very valuable for us to do a regular examination of conscience so that we can catch stuff like that early and nip it in the bud. We Dominicans make a point of doing such an examination every night, because it is like an early health screening for our souls. Let us all strive to keep a close watch on how we are doing with the Lord and each other. With such a precaution, we have a much better shot at staying in good spiritual health!







