

Pastor's Corner



One of the side-ministry commitments Father Gregory and I have is celebrating monthly masses at Saint Patrick/Saint Vincent High School. This past week, as a way of gearing up for Catholic Schools Week, I celebrated a mass there that included students from

Sacramento's Cristo Rev and Christian Brothers High Schools. The tri-school mass's overall theme was evangelization, and the Gospel reading we had for it was very fitting from Matthew 5. Jesus proclaims, "You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, how shall it be seasoned? It is then good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men. 'You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden." I pointed out to the teenagers that through this analogy, Jesus was calling them to flavor the culture by allowing his grace to animate how they conducted themselves in it. I cautioned them that it is very easy for us as Christians, rather than flavoring the culture with the Gospel's good news, to instead be flavored by the secular cultural norms, which makes us go proverbially bland. This undermines us as instruments by which Our Lord is able to make himself known to those around us. I told the teens that what makes us especially susceptible to losing our flavor is when we draw our sense of dignity from the vain approval of those around us, rather than God's love for us. It is one of my favorite topics, especially with preteens and teenagers because that is the general age when people really start struggling with that problem. It is quite a powerful difficulty that vexes most of us to some extent. The earlier we learn how to work at overcoming it, the better! I cautioned the kids that if their sense of their own dignity, their ability to feel confident and good about themselves came from the vain approval of their peers, their sense of innerpower would be in the hands of those peers – peers who would be able to give them that sense of innerpower or take it away. By contrast, the extent to which we draw our sense of inner power from God's love for us, that is something no other human being can take away from us if we choose not to let them have it. Of course, expressing that idea through one's speech is a lot easier than actually cultivating it deeply in one's soul. For most us, it ends up being a lifelong project, one that can become more and more successful as we work at growing in our faith. So let's get working at it!




While many people know the date as Groundhog Day, the celebration of Feb. 2 in the Catholic Church began far earlier than 1887, the year people across the United States started looking for a woodchuck's shadow.

The Catholic feast has many names, including the feast of the Presentation of Our Lord, the feast of the Purification of Our Lady, the feast of the Encounter and Candlemas.

Nomenclature aside, the feast celebrates the event recorded in Luke 2:22-38: Mary and Joseph's presentation of Jesus in the Temple 40 days after his birth and the response from Anna, the prophetess, and Simeon of Jerusalem. (National Catholic Register) Candles blessed at these Masses are then taken home by the faithful to be used for devotional purposes as a reminder of Christ, the light of the world.
