### **Pastor's Corner**



This past week, we had a daily mass reading from Mark 3 in which some 'big-shot' scribes from Jerusalem had arrived where Jesus was preaching to evaluate him. In response to Jesus' successful casting out of demons from people, rather than taking it as a sign of Our Lord's legitimacy,

they give it a negative spin. They accuse Christ of being possessed by a demon and claim that it is by the power of the prince of demons that he casts out demons. Jesus answers back that it would be a counterproductive strategy for the devil to try expanding his own power over God's people by casting his own minions out of those people. He would seem to be undermining his own goals. I think what we can see on the part of the scribes is willful ignorance. They are firmly bent on seeing Jesus as a problem, and so even if they witness Jesus solving problems, like demonic possession, they immediately and viciously concoct and promote the counter-scenario that it is by demonic power that Jesus casts out demons. The Gospel seems to be suggesting that a stubborn disposition is dominating those scribes' mindsets, driving them to recast anything they learn about Jesus, no matter what, into something (anything) that can plausibly fit the narrative they are bent firmly on spreading about Jesus. This sort of willful ignorance ends up being a helpful context for us to understand what Jesus means at the end of the Gospel reading about what he considers an unforgiveable sin. "Amen, I say to you, all sins and all blasphemies that people utter will be forgiven them. But whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an everlasting sin. For they had said, 'He has an unclean spirit.'" Since the time of the early church, the Catholic conception of this 'unforgiveable' sin has been understood to be what is called "final impenitence." Through final impenitence, a person goes to his or her grave pridefully and stubbornly refusing Christ's salvation, which, of course, comes to us by way of the Holy Spirit while being rooted in the cross of Christ. Jesus seems to be indicating that the sort of willful ignorance of the Jerusalem scribes, if one persists in it, can lead a person into final impenitence. Clearly, willful ignorance is a dangerous habit! Let us all be on guard against it in the various aspects of our lives!




