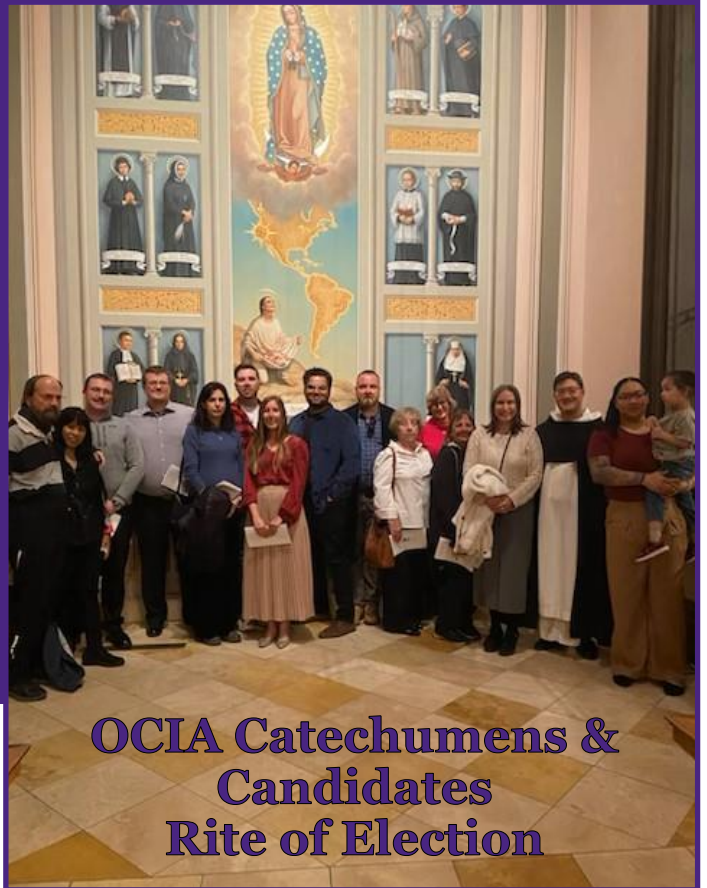

Pastor's Corner



When I was eleven years old, my parents took my two sisters and me on a travel trailer trip across the country, and one of the places we visited was the Loretto Chapel in Santa Fe, New Mexico. It was exciting to see it because our family had recently seen a TV documentary

about the origin of the staircase, and it was cool to see it in person. It is a perfect story to read right now, given that this Wednesday is the Solemnity of St. Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Here at St. Dominic's, this Wednesday, we will have a special mass for the solemnity at 6pm, and then there will be a free Italian dinner in the parish hall with a traditional St. Joseph Altar! Check out this article on the staircase at the Loretto Chapel in Santa Fe!

In 1873, construction on the Chapel of Our Lady of Light in Santa Fe, New Mexico hit a roadblock. The beautiful Gothic-style chapel had no staircase to get from the main level to the choir loft. The original architect had died, and his plans for a staircase were unknown. The sisters of Loretto, who had commissioned the chapel, were distraught. They consulted with several architects and carpenters, but the answer was always the same: it couldn't be done. There just wasn't enough space to build a staircase to the choir loft. They were going to have to accept that they couldn't access the choir loft. Not quite ready to give up, the sisters said a novena to St. Joseph, the master carpenter, asking him to help them find a builder with a solution. As soon as the sisters finished the novena, a man arrived at their doorstep saying that he could build them a staircase—his only request was to work in complete privacy. The sisters agreed, and the man locked himself in the chapel to work. Some say it only took him one night, while others say it took months. However long it took to build, the staircase the man crafted for the sisters was nothing short of incredible. The man departed just as mysteriously as he had arrived, leaving behind one of the most marvelous pieces of woodworking ever seen. The staircase has two 360-degree spirals in it and was built with no central support, resting only on its base. It was built without nails—just wood pegs. Carpenters and scientists have said that the construction is nearly impossible and shouldn't be able to support anyone walking on it. Yet the staircase stands solid to this day. The chapel has become a museum now, but it is a must-see if you're ever in New Mexico. And who was the mysterious builder? Well, the Sisters of Loretto were confident that their mystery man was none other than St. Joseph himself.

The tradition of the "St. Joseph Table" of food ("la tavola di San Giuseppe") has its origins in Sicily. Legends from the Middle Ages attributed the end of a devastating drought to a prayer-devotion that the Sicilian people made to St. Joseph. This celebration is a symbolic "thank you" and renewal of the Sicilian people's devotion to St. Joseph. It's a shared celebration with the entire community where the riches of food are given as alms to the poor: Traditional etiquette is that no one can be turned away from this table.

COLORS OF LENT

When you visit a Catholic church, attend Mass, or pray the Stations of the Cross, you'll notice certain colors repeated in the decorations and the priest's vestments. Each one of these colors holds great meaning.

Purple: Purple is the primary color of Lent. The color purple symbolizes our need for repentance. It also represents the purple robe that Pontius Pilate placed on Jesus before he was crucified and reminds us of the royalty of Jesus as King. Late in the Lenten season, your parish might cover every statue or painting with a deep purple cloth.

FASTING DURING LENT

Fasting is a way of pausing to open ourselves to the Word of God. In this act we can cast off the idols that bind our lives and allow our hearts to revive. Only when we empty our hands are we ready to receive something new into them. So let's take care to cleanse our hearts so that they are ready for the graces with which God wants to fill our lives at Easter.

WHY FAST?

There is great wisdom in the Christian practice of fasting—even though its benefits are largely forgotten. Fasting is a spiritual exercise, and as such is primarily an action of the inner life. Authentic fasting draws us nearer to God and opens our hearts to receive his many gifts. Fasting is also a sharp reminder that there are more important things in life than food. Authentic Christian fasting helps to release us from our attachments to the things of this world. It is often these worldly attachments that prevent us from becoming the-best-version-of-ourselves. Fasting also serves as a reminder that everything in this world is passing and thus encourages us to consider life beyond death.

Try going without food for several hours and you will quickly realize how truly weak, fragile, and dependent we are. This self-knowledge strips away arrogance and fosters a loving acknowledgment of our utter dependence on God.

Once you realize the spiritual power of fasting, you'll notice that it can be applied to aspects of life beyond food. You can fast from TV, social media, cursing, gossip, or any other habit that doesn't feed your soul. This Lent, make a point to rediscover the power of fasting in your life! -Dynamic Catholic

There's an old Latin phrase, *Ite ad Joseph*, which simply means, "Go to Joseph." Saint Joseph, the adoptive father of Jesus, holds special significance for all fathers.

As much as 93% of communication in an adult is non-verbal. It may be even higher in children. Perhaps this is why there is not a single recorded word spoken by Joseph in the Scriptures.

Yet his silent presence spoke volumes. Joseph moved his family under his own and God's protection to Egypt when King Herod sought to kill the baby Jesus. He provided a stable and loving environment for Jesus to grow in "wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man." (Luke 2:52) And he worked with dignity, lovingly passing on his trade to Jesus, who would later be referred to as "the carpenter's son." (Matthew 13:55)

There is so much to be said about Saint Joseph. But there is even more to ponder, and dream about. When it was just Joseph and Jesus alone in a room, what did they talk about? When Jesus was a little boy, did Joseph cradle him in his arms and rock him back and forth? We can imagine he did, because he was a great father.

Fathers spend their days and weeks, months and years encouraging others. But today, in honor of Saint Joseph, let's not forget that fathers themselves need a little encouragement and reassurance from time to time. -Today's Saint, Dynamic Catholic
