

Pastor's Corner



This past week's Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Spouse of Mary was such a joyful success! We had a great turnout for the mass at 5:30pm, and then even more people joined us for the free spaghetti dinner afterwards. It was a wonderfully diverse crowd with many young families and a good number of

new faces, which is so encouraging. We received loads of canned food for the poor, and take a look at

the St. Joseph altar featured at the event! This was created by our very own Justin Reyes who does all of the flower arrangements and other similar devotional displays at St. Dominic's. Justin really outdid himself for St. Joseph! The dinner was a collaboration uniting our hospitality ministry, Society of Saint Vincent de Paul, and the Knights of Columbus. For my homily at



the mass. I reiterated what I said about Saint Joseph at an earlier mass that day. The solemnity provided a great opportunity to preach to our middle-school age boys about the kind of husband they should be if they are called to marriage and to our middle-school age girls about what they should expect from their prospective husbands. This is quite relevant to a topic near and dear to many parents' hearts – the need of good prospective husbands for our daughters. A concerning trend I have noticed over the past fifteen years or so in California Catholic young adult groups is that there seem to be way more eligible Catholic bachelorettes than eligible Catholic bachelors. The groups tend to have a lot of topnotch young women. but the men, by comparison, are often a mix of some who are ready for marriage, and then a fair number of others who are still trying to get their acts together. To this day, I know women from the Catholic young adult group I attended during my twenties who are still trying to find good husbands. These are faithful, smart, lovely women. It's a real shame. Young men need our prayers and any other support we can give them! The wellbeing of our daughters hangs in the balance. In light of this, next year, as a parish, we are going to pray a nine-day novena to Saint Joseph, Spouse of Mary with a joint intention of praying for good prospective Catholic husbands for our Catholic daughters. In the meantime, let's ask for Saint Joseph's intercession in this matter now. The better flourishing of the Church requires good husbands and wife who take Joseph and Mary as exemplars!

REFLECT ON THE SEVEN SORROWS OF OUR LADY THIS LENT

Devotion to Our Lady of Sorrows is very ancient, and over many centuries pious customs have been developed to enter into the heart of Mary, which was pierced so "thoughts out of many hearts may be revealed" (Luke 2:35).

One such custom owes its origin to the Servite Order, founded in 1233 by a group called the Seven Holy Founders. From the very beginning they sought to live a life dedicated to Our Lady of Sorrows. Through their spirituality they developed a list of the "7 Sorrows of Mary." It recalls seven events in the life of Mary when she experienced great sorrow. They also developed a Rosary that meditates on the seven sorrow events, pondering what was going on in Mary's heart.

VIRTUE IS BUILT THROUGH HABIT

Lent is an invitation to grow in virtue — to <u>form habits that don't just disappear after Easter</u> but shape us for the rest of our lives. By adding practices that strengthen faith, discipline, and charity, we can make Lent not just a season of self-denial, but a season of transformation.

Aristotle famously taught that virtue is not just about knowing what is good but doing it consistently. He wrote, "We are what we repeatedly do. Excellence, then, is not an act but a habit" (Nicomachean Ethics, II.1).

St. <u>Thomas Aquinas expanded on this</u>, explaining that virtue is habitual goodness — a stable disposition to act rightly. This means that the holiest people are not just those who make good choices in a moment, but those who train themselves to choose the good again and again, until it becomes second nature.

Lent is the perfect time to begin that training. By adding small but meaningful habits to our daily lives, we form ourselves into the kind of people who naturally choose God, not just for 40 days, but for a lifetime. - Aleteia

Heavenly Father.

As I enter another week of my Lenten journey, guide me to the path that leads to you. Fill my heart with gratitude, patience, strength, and peace as I strive to become the-best-version-of-myself. Let me hear your voice in the deepest reaches of my heart. Give me rest in you. Help me to accept others, showing them your great love instead of casting judgment. Stay with me through the busy days this week and remind me that when I need comfort, solitude, wisdom, or guidance, I can always turn to you. Amen. (Dynamic Catholic)


