## **Pastor's Corner**



This past Monday, our Seven Sorrows of Mary devotional evening was beautiful and moving. The lights were turned off, and numerous candles were placed in order to draw attention to images of Jesus and the Blessed Mother positioned in front of the altar. The image of Jesus was a sculpted work

of art depicting Jesus after he had died and was taken down from the cross. The sculpture goes back many,

many decades of our parish's history, possibly to the early 1900s. Back when our parish was blessed to have a huge population of very active Portuguese parishioners, it was an annual Portuguese custom to process this image of the dead



Jesus around the church on Good Friday at the Liturgy of the Passion of the Lord. St. Dominic's still does this on Good Fridays at the evening liturgy. It is a painted sculpture, and every time I look at its depiction of Jesus' face, I think, "Boy, they sure don't make them like that anymore." It's beautiful work with a vivid intensity. It was wonderful that our Seven Sorrow of Mary evening provided another occasion on which our parishioners' prayer could be aided by this heirloom of St. Dominic's. Before the prayer service began, our talented and faithful Confirmation volunteer Shaina Manalo gently played some reflective worship songs from the piano. Then, Father Gregory and I started things off by chanting the Dominican version of Ave Regina Caelorum, translated "Hail, Queen of Heaven." After that, we had scripture readings for all of the Seven Sorrows of Mary, reflection time for each, and then special guided prayers. At the end, I preached a homily on the value of striving to have sorrow that emulates the sorrow of Mary, which is a sorrow containing hope and healing. The service lasted a little under forty-five minutes, which was a fitting length. I say this because Shaina continued playing worship songs, and the attendees were welcome to stay, reflect, and pray up close to the images of Blessed Mother and Jesus, and still get home at an early hour. We are definitely going to bring this event back next year. The devotion's emphasis on Mary's sorrow is not meant to make us feel like 'sad sacks,' but rather to purify our sorrow, to help us have sorrow rooted in appreciation of what the Father is offering us in Jesus and hope that more will obtain the salvific rewards of his Passion.

## LAETARE OR FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT

Laetare Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent. The word laetare means "rejoice" in Latin.

Though many Catholics may associate the liturgical season of Lent more with the practice of fasting and abstaining from food, many families around the world use the 40-day season to prepare specific homemade delicacies to remind them of the life of Jesus Christ as he made his way to the cross.

#### Mexico

Capirotada, which is similar to a bread pudding, is a treat served by many Mexican families on the Fridays of Lent. Though recipes may vary from one family to the next, the traditional sweet and savory ingredients carry rich religious symbolism linked to Jesus' crucifixion.

Bread rolls used in the dish represent the body of Christ; honey or piloncillo syrup, made from cane sugar, is meant to symbolize the blood of Christ; whole cloves are used to represent the nails of the crucifixion; cinnamon sticks are used to symbolize the wooden cross of Christ; and the melted cheese coating the pudding represents the shroud used for Jesus' burial.

#### **Ecuador**

Fanesca, a soup eaten during Lent and Holy Week made with cod and 12 kinds of beans and legumes, is said to represent Jesus Christ and the Twelve Apostles at the Last Supper.

The dish's religious significance dates back to the 16th century and is believed to be connected to a monastery in Quito, Ecuador, during the Spanish colonization of the Americas.

Some families take advantage to make this lunch dish together — preparing the fish and shelling the many beans and legumes — with a spirit of prayer, contemplating the Last Supper in the upper room

just hours before Jesus began his passion in the Garden of Gethsemane.

### Malta

Kwareżimal, which derives its name from the Latin word "Quadragesima," meaning the "40 days of Lent," are sweet cakes made with almond paste, honey, and orange rind.

This Lenten sweet treat is also given to children who want to embark upon a one-day, 14-church pilgrimage to

remember Jesus' 14 Stations of the Cross.


## FASTING AND FEASTING PRAYER



















# 40 DAYS FOR LIFE...
