## **Pastor's Corner**



Things sure have been a whirlwind around here since Father David's passing. His vigil and funeral turned out beautiful and very much in the overall spirit of Father David, which was our goal. Both events packed the church with a mix of Dominicans and many,

many laypeople. Numerous parishioners expressed how much they enjoyed joining the Dominicans for the rosary and Office of the Dead, the latter being something they had never experienced before. The eulogy delivered by Father Peter Rogers captured Father David very well, although I did not know Father David was so notoriously frugal as a pastor. Wednesday morning's funeral was both healing and happy. The music captured precisely the vibe we were seeking, and what a delight it was to have Annabelle Cruz in the mix, providing vocals and her gorgeous violin-playing, along with Teri Hurlbut's



terrific piano-playing. I was amazed at how Annabelle and our music director Luke Shalz managed to change roles throughout the mass to maximize use of their varied talents. At some points, Luke was directing the singers while

Annabelle played the violin. At other points, Annabelle directed the vocalists while Luke played the organ, and sometimes, Luke even managed to direct the choir while playing the flute! Father Michael Hurley's homily featured everything one would want and expect from his preaching – theological richness delivered in an easily understandable way, plus all of that jovial humor that came through stories conveying what could be described fittingly as, "classic Father

David." It was moving to have so many parishioners with us brothers at St. Dominic's Cemetery as we watched his coffin descend to the earth and then chanted the Salve Regina, which we do at every



Dominican burial at that point. At the reception back at St. Dominic's, there was no shortage of joy, albeit with some tears, too. Father David would have applauded the Kinder's barbeque menu of beef and chicken. He was always happy to be served chicken, so long as he could have dark meat, which he would sometimes call "brown meat." From the vigil, to the funeral, burial, and then the reception, the whole thing went so well. And Father David deserved it. Well, on to Holy Week!

## FIVE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT PALM SUNDAY

1) Meaning Behind The Palms: The palms symbolize peace and victory.

It was customary during Jesus' time for people to pay homage by laying palm branches-or even clothes-in front of people who were owed a great amount of respect.

Special Note: If you receive the blessed Palms at Mass on Sunday, do not throw them away or discard them! Instead, return unwanted palms to your parish to be used in making ashes for Ash Wednesday. According to Canon Law (1171), blessed items are to be treated with reverence. If there is a need to dispose of such items, they must be buried or burned.

The Directory on Popular Piety and the Liturgy states: "Palms or olive branches should not be kept as amulets, or for therapeutic or magical reasons to dispel evil spirits or to prevent the damage these cause in the fields or in the homes, all of which can assume a certain superstitious guise." Palms and olive branches are kept in the home as a witness to faith in Jesus Christ, the messianic king, and in his Paschal Victory.


- 2) The Palm Sunday Procession: On Palm Sunday, the faithful receive palm branches at the beginning of Mass followed by a procession. Doing so invites us to reenact Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem. Palm Sunday has been commemorated in various ways throughout Church History. The Church standardized and simplified Palm Sunday traditions in 1955. With this came the option of an organized procession that begins somewhere outside the church, a solemn procession that begins outside the church, or no procession at all.
- 3) Entering the Scene During Palm Sunday Mass: "Joyful acclamations at Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem, followed by his humiliation. Festive cries followed by brutal torture. This twofold mystery accompanies our entrance into Holy Week each year, as reflected in the two characteristic moments of today's celebration: the initial procession with palm branches and the solemn reading of the Passion." Pope Francis (April 14, 2019) On Palm Sunday, we dive deep into Saint Luke's account of Jesus' last days (and moments) of life on earth.
- 4) Christ's Entry to Jerusalem Was Foretold in the Old Testament: "Exult greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout for joy, O daughter Jerusalem! Behold: your king is coming to you, a just savior is he, Humble, and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey." Zechariah 9:9
- 5) Palm Sunday is a Time for Reflection Before Holy Week: Saint Bernard of Clairvaux offered a homily about the significance of Palm Sunday and the account of Christ's entry into Jerusalem: "How different the cries, 'Away with him, away with him, crucify him,' and then, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, hosanna, in the highest!' How different the cries that now are calling him 'King of Israel' and then in a few days' time will be saying, 'We have no king but Caesar!' What a contrast between the green branches and the cross, between the flowers and the thorns! Before they were offering their own clothes for him to walk upon, and so soon afterwards they are stripping him of his, and casting lots upon them."
