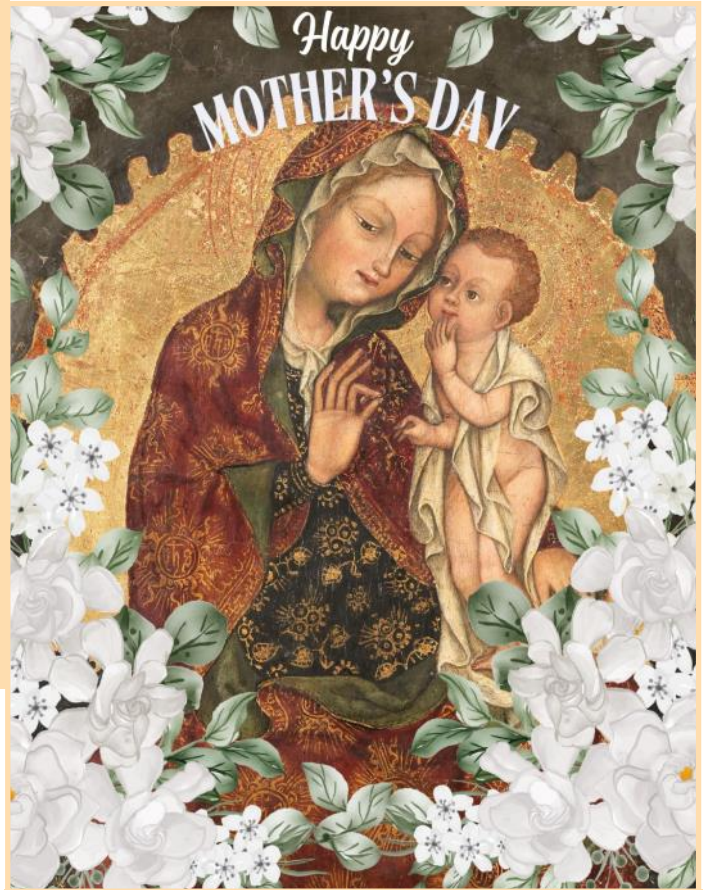

## Pastor's Corner



Habemus papam! We have a pope! He is the first pope from the United States, which is pretty cool. It is interesting that our new pontiff, Pope Leo XIV, took the name of a past pope widely seen as an important figure in the development of Catholic social teaching, Pope Leo XIII who wrote the encyclical Rerum Novarum –

“On Capital and Labor.” In that encyclical, the pontiff talked about the mutual duties of capital and labor in the united goal of enabling people at all levels of society to have a just share in the world's resources. The document supported the rights of labor to form unions, rejected socialism but also unrestricted capitalism, and affirmed the right to private property. Those are all very relevant subject matter in regard to many of the debates happening around the world, especially in the U.S., so it will be interesting to see what Pope Leo XIV ends up contributing to that discussion. Let us all strive to greet him with open ears and a charitable heart.

It sure is fun seeing our kids running around in their First Holy Communion cloths this weekend. They have begun an essential step in their journey as Christians. When they enter the communion line, they no longer always have to cross their arms when they approach the sacrament but can now partake of the supper of the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. Jesus tells us in John 6 that eating his flesh and drinking his blood, which we understand in sacramental terms, provides us a share in his everlasting life. He also tells us in John 6 that reception of his body and blood plays a role in our friendship with him, enabling him to be in us and us in him in a very special way. Through the Eucharist, Jesus shares a kind of one-flesh union with us, which speaks to a very intimate friendship with him to which he is calling us. Jesus is not meant to be the sort of friend we keep at a distance and check in with only a few times a year. Rather, we are being invited to share our entire lives with him, drawing our life from his life, which is a life that cannot die and knows the greatest happiness that can possibly be known. The Eucharist is meant both to give us this life and strengthen us is allowing it progressively to empower every aspect of our souls. Congratulations, kids! Also, to our mothers: Happy Mother's Day! Hope you can join us for one of our 6:30pm Wednesday rosary processions in this month dedicated to our heavenly mother!

## **Featured Marian Devotion**

Our Lady of Fatima - May 13

On May 13, 1917, the Blessed Virgin Mary first appeared to three shepherd children, Lúcia dos Santos, Francisco Marto, and Jacinta Marto, at the Cova da Iria outside the village of Aljustrel, near Fatima, Portugal. In the months that followed, the children would see Mary five more times. On the sixth and last appearance, the Virgin told the children her name: The Lady of the Rosary. Throughout these appearances, the children received prophetic messages of prayer, penance and peace called the "Secret," and residents of Fatima witnessed a stunning atmospheric event that would become known as the Miracle of the Sun. The full meaning of the miracles of Fatima would not be understood until decades beyond — and now, a century later, they continue to inspire the faithful across the globe.



## Habemus Papam! Pope Leo XIV

With the election of Pope Leo XIV—Robert Francis Prevost, the first American to ascend to the papacy—the Catholic Church turns a new page, guided by a name rich in historical resonance. The choice of “Leo” aligns him with a lineage of pontiffs who have shaped the Church’s doctrine, diplomacy, and social mission.

### The legacy of the Leos

The name “Leo” has been borne by thirteen previous popes, each leaving a distinct mark on the Church’s history. The first, Pope Leo I (440–461), known as Leo the Great, was pivotal in defining Christological doctrine and strengthening the authority of the papacy. His persuasive encounter with Attila the Hun, urging the invader to spare Rome, remains a testament to his diplomatic acumen. Centuries later, Pope Leo XIII (1878–1903) emerged as a champion of social justice. His encyclical *Rerum Novarum* addressed the rights and conditions of laborers, laying the groundwork for modern Catholic social teaching. By choosing the name Leo XIV, the new pope signals a continuity with these predecessors’ commitment to doctrinal clarity and social responsibility.

### A new chapter with Pope Leo XIV

Born in Chicago in 1955, Robert Prevost brings a wealth of pastoral and administrative experience to the papacy. His missionary work in Peru and leadership within the Augustinian order reflect a deep commitment to service and evangelization. As head of the Vatican’s Dicastery for Bishops, he played a crucial role in shaping the global episcopate. In his inaugural address, Pope Leo XIV emphasized themes of peace, dialogue, and unity, echoing the pastoral priorities of his namesakes. “Peace be with you,” he greeted the faithful, underscoring a vision of the Church as a reconciliatory presence in a divided world.

### Anticipating the path ahead

Pope Leo XIV inherits a Church (and a world) facing numerous challenges. Drawing inspiration from the legacy of the Leos, he is poised to navigate these complexities with a blend of doctrinal fidelity and compassionate outreach. As the Church embarks on this new chapter, the historical weight of the name “Leo” offers both a foundation and a beacon, guiding Pope Leo XIV in his mission to shepherd a global and diverse flock.

### A Prayer for the Pope

*Lord, source of eternal life and truth, give to your shepherd a spirit of courage and right judgment, a spirit of knowledge and love. By governing with fidelity those entrusted to his care, may he, as successor to the Apostle Peter and Vicar of Christ, build your Church into a sacrament of unity, love and peace for all the world. Amen.*
