Pastor's Corner



I sure had fun today preaching to our school kids about Saint Athanasius who played an important role in the Church's theology of Christ's divinity. Saint Athanasius was a fourth century bishop of Alexandria in Egypt during a time when a major heresy that undermined Christ's divinity called

Arianism was very fashionable. Saint Athanasius was an outspoken critic of this heresy, which made him quite unpopular with some very influential powerplayers who managed to get Athanasius exiled several times. I pointed out to our kids today that while Saint Athanasius may not have seemed very fashionable to his many detractors and those who walked in lockstep with them, Arianism would ultimately flame out while history would go on to judge Saint Athanasius as one of our great theologians on Christ's divinity and other matters. I used the story to encourage the kids to always take the long view in staying close to their faith when it may conflict with fads of the day. I reminded them that anything truly at odds with their faith would flame out in the end, while those united to Christ would reign with him for eternity.

It was great being back out in the Benicia Farmers

Market! We gave out so many rosaries and had numerous conversations with strangers that seemed very fruitful. Please keep those people in your prayers, and let us hope we see some of them at a Sunday mass soon. As many of you know, when I meet people out there on 1st Street



and they accept one of our rosaries, I offer to bless it and then bless them in the process as well. It was handy having Deacon Mike as a wingman this time because, as a cleric, he was able to do blessings, too! Also, the weather was pretty good. I had better enjoy that while it lasts! It can get crazy hot out there, but our mission is worth it!



In other news, we have a new retired friar in our community. He is Father Anthony Rosevear, O.P. Father Anthony was novice master to me, Father Gregory, and many, many other friars because he held that job for over twenty years. You are going to love Father Anthony! 
May Activities for the Family







