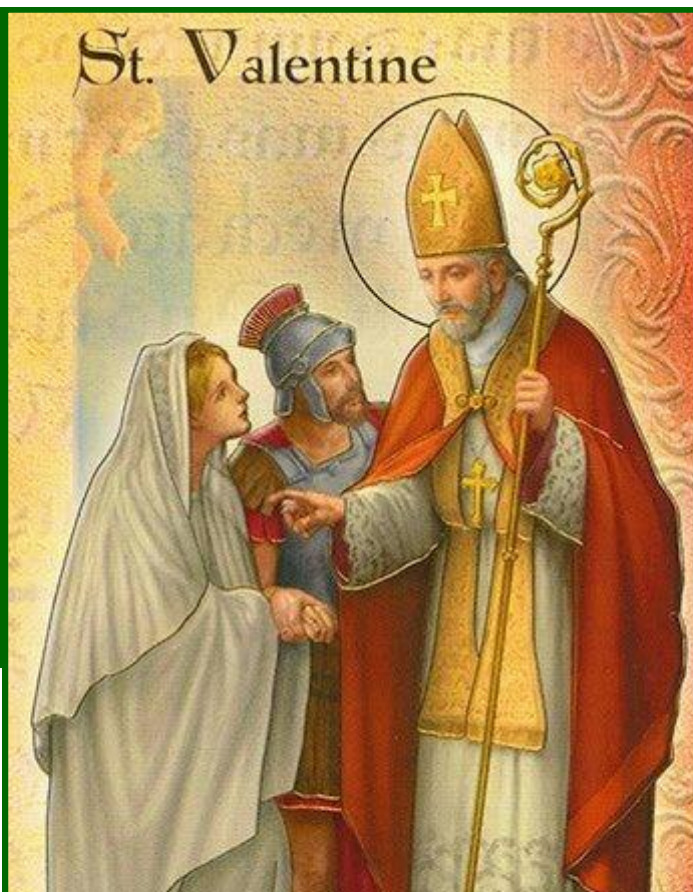

Brother's Corner

The beginning of Lent is quickly approaching, with Ash Wednesday on February 18th. If you haven't started already, now is the time to prepare! But before we make any resolutions, it's worth pausing to consider what is Lent and what is the point?

During Lent, we are led by the Spirit into the wilderness with Jesus. There, He fasted for forty days and nights to prepare for His earthly ministry. A reasonable person might ask: if Jesus is God, what kind of preparation does He need? None of course! Rather, Jesus fasts for our sake—He gives us an example to follow, showing us how to place ourselves completely into the Father's hands.

Lent is the season where we take an honest look at how we are living as Christians. We remember the uncomfortable truth that we will die—that this life is temporary. In light of this reality, we are called to "Repent and believe in the Gospel." Lent is about conversion—turning away from sin and turning back toward God.

How do we do this practically? Traditionally, the Church calls all Catholics to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Lent is a special time of prayer (not that prayer is unimportant the rest of the year!), during which we deepen our relationship with the Lord who loves us immeasurably, despite our ingratitude.

Fasting is another essential part of Lent. At a minimum, the Church asks us to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and every Friday of Lent, and for those between the ages of 18 to 59 to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition to this, we typically "give something up." Whatever we give up should be challenging, reasonable, and responsible. A helpful rule of thumb is that your penance should not become someone else's penance. Another option is to add something by giving up free time to spend it with the Lord.

Almsgiving, strictly speaking, means giving money to the poor. More broadly, it includes any concrete act of charity or service toward others.

A reasonable person might ask, if God wants me to be happy, why does the Church ask me to give up good things I enjoy? Lent teaches us to let go of lesser goods for the sake of greater ones. Its purpose is not misery, but joy—found through repentance, freedom from sin, and a deeper closeness to God. Make this Lent great!

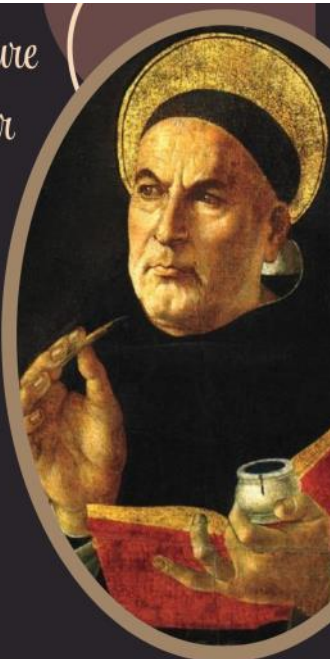

Traditional Lenten Practices

We all need a fresh start from time to time, and Lent is the perfect time to embark on that journey. Maybe you need a fresh start in your personal finances, or perhaps you need a fresh start in your marriage. Maybe you need a fresh start in a relationship with a child or a parent, or possibly you need a fresh start in your health and well-being. It could even be that you need a fresh start in your career. For generations, Catholics have developed different traditions that help them make a new beginning during Lent. Here are just a few examples:

Give Something Up: Many Catholics “give up” something for the entire Lenten season. A classic example is giving up chocolate, but you don’t have to stop there! You could give up negative thinking, speaking poorly about others, or procrastinating. You could also make a positive swap: like praying the Rosary instead of watching TV, or reading an amazing Catholic book instead of scrolling through social media.

Join a Spiritual Challenge: One of the simplest ways to transform your Lent is to join other Catholics for a spiritual challenge. You could create a small challenge with your friends, sign up for a local Bible study, or join a forty day challenge.

Deepen Your Prayer: Catholics often will say special Lenten prayers. One of the most popular spiritual practices during Lent is the Stations of the Cross. The Stations of the Cross is one of the most simple, yet powerful, ways to prayerfully walk alongside Jesus during his Passion...and encounter him like never before. Hallow App of Formed.org are good resources.

Attend a Soup Supper: One delicious Catholic tradition is hosting a fish fry or soup supper. Since Catholics don’t eat meat on Fridays during Lent, many parishes have a pescatarian meal together on Fridays—often inviting the larger community to participate too. Here at St. Dominic’s we have stations of the cross followed by soup supper on Fridays. Each Friday is sponsored by ministries. Take this opportunity to engage with your community!

Giving During Lent: In the earliest of times giving to the poor, or almsgiving, has been an invaluable spiritual practice. At St. Dominic’s we are able to assist the poor in our community through the SVdP, but giving doesn’t always only mean money. We are also called to give of oneself during Lent and throughout the year. During Lent we can often find ways to give a little extra. Find ways to “fast” in spending or wasting time and devote that time and money to a charitable organization in your community such as the church or St. Vincent de Paul.

Take On Something New: 40 days of phone calls to important people in your life, 40 random acts of kindness, 40 days of reading the Bible, 40 days of spiritual journaling, 40 days of community service, join in the 40 Days for Life, 40 days committed to praying the rosary, or a combination of things you add to your routine!

Our God loves fresh starts. How is he inviting you to a fresh start this Lent?

What are Stations of the Cross?

The "Stations of the Cross," also called the "Way of the Cross" or "Via Crucis," represent a series of 14 depictions of key moments in Jesus' final hours leading up to his crucifixion and burial, allowing Christians to meditate on his suffering and sacrifice through prayer and reflection on each "station" along the journey to Calvary, essentially making a spiritual pilgrimage through these events without physically being in Jerusalem where they took place.

Purpose: To deeply contemplate the pain and sacrifice Jesus endured during his Passion, providing a way for Christians to personally connect with his suffering.

Origin: The practice originated from pilgrims who would physically walk the path Jesus took in Jerusalem, known as the "Via Dolorosa," and later evolved into a devotional practice with visual representations of these events.
