Pastor's Corner



On my day off this past week, I went to see a movie I recommend called I Can Only Imagine 2, released on February 20th. It was a sequel to 2018's I Can Only Imagine, a biopic about personal struggles overcome by Bart Millard, the lead singer of a popular

Christian band called MercyMe. The first movie, which I had not seen, depicted Millard overcoming trauma that had been inflicted on him by his violent father, portrayed by Dennis Quaid, which culminated in Millard writing and releasing the song "I Can Only Imagine," a massive Christian radio hit in 2001. The sequel dramatizes struggles Millard faced with his own son years after that success and Millard's friendship with another Christian artist named Tim Timmons. Timmons was played by Milo Ventimiglia, known for playing Jess on "Gilmore Girls," as well as TV's "This is Us" and "Heroes." Last weekend, I stumbled upon an interview between Ventimiglia and the film's director in which Ventimiglia shared how much working on the movie and with the real-life Tim Timmons had impacted him, spiritually. It sounds like the actor is still exploring in terms of his own interior journey, but, nevertheless, he expressed having been profoundly moved by Timmons' witness of his own faith, and the two men are now good friends. For my entire youth, including throughout my twenties, faith-films almost always seemed cringingly cheesy and amateurish. But ever since the Chosen series was released in 2017, Christian film and television-makers finally seem capable of conveying their messages through well-crafted entertainment. With its story about how God is often found in the midst of tribulations, I Can Only Imagine 2 flows nicely, taking time for its very moving emotional moments, but without becoming draggy or overly heavy, thanks also to levity provided by the supporting characters. This was one of the fresher "inspirational biopics" I had seen in a while. Over the past fifteen years, many of the flicks of this genre have seemed to me hackneyed, like they came off some sort of inspirational biopic conveyor belt. I was glad to have given the makers of I Can Only Imagine 2 a ticket-sale! Before the movie started, there was a cool-looking trailer from Angel Studios for Young Washington, a movie depicting our first president as a twenty-two-year-old fighter in the French and Indian War and how the experience transformed him into the man who would later lead our nation's revolution to victory. Our parish will be busy with the Torchlight Parade on the movie's opening night of July 3rd, but I definitely want to catch that one! On a related topic, movie theaters sure have become ghost towns, even on the weekends, I hear. It seems kind of sad. I have many fond memories of going to the movies with friends as a teenager. Where do high school kids go to get out of the house on weekends these days? I guess I'll ask our youth group kids.

The Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (O.C.I.A.)

During the 11:00 a.m. Masses in March, we will have the joy of witnessing important liturgical rites that are part of our journey toward Easter. These include the Penitential Rite and the Scrutinies. What is a Scrutiny? It's a profound liturgical rite observed during Lent, which are essential steps for our OCIA catechumens and candidates as they prepare to fully enter the Church at the Easter Vigil. During the Scrutinies, the Church prays for these individuals to be freed from sin and strengthened in the face of temptation, inviting them to a deeper conversion and understanding of Jesus Christ as they prepare to fully join the Catholic Church.

March 1 — Penitential Rite

Readings: Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7; Psalm 51; Romans 5:12-19; Matthew 4:1-11
The Penitential Rite marks a moment of purification for our candidates, acknowledging human frailty and seeking God's mercy to strengthen their hearts.

March 8 — 1st Scrutiny

Readings: Exodus 17:3-7; Psalm 95; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8; John 4:5-42
The First Scrutiny encourages the catechumens to come to God's living water, recognizing any obstacles in embracing Christ.

As a parish community, let's accompany our catechumens with our prayers and solidarity, witnessing their journey as a reminder of our own baptismal call to holiness. May these rites lead all of us to a deeper conversion and renewal as we prepare for Easter.
