## Brother's Corner

A recent initiative at the parish—one that many of you are probably aware of—is my *Catechism 102* question-and-answer sessions. Visiting the 8th, 6th, and 4th grade classrooms and holding Q&A sessions there inspired me to open them up to the whole parish. You would be surprised at the kinds of questions the students ask! At times, I have had to do a fair amount of research in order to answer them well. One of the most challenging questions so far concerned the tenth plague: how could an all-loving God permit the death of Egypt's firstborn sons? I have found the students' attentiveness and their sincere desire to learn more about God and the faith incredibly encouraging.



I have also been very pleased with how our first two parish sessions have gone (and I hope you have been too, if you attended). During the first session, I was fairly sick—someone even commented that I looked like I had been hit by a truck! Nevertheless, it was a joy to answer the questions that were submitted. We covered a wide range of topics, from the Nicene Creed to the sacraments to God in Himself, just to name a few. By the end of the evening, I was exhausted—but grateful for having had the opportunity to teach the faith.

For the second session, I realized that rather than having a complete open-floor Q&A, it would be more helpful to focus on a particular theme. So, on February 25th, we discussed Sacred Scripture. We began with *Dei Verbum*, one of the documents of the Second Vatican Council, and explored what Divine Revelation is—something broader than Scripture alone, though Scripture is certainly central. We discussed why Revelation is necessary and how it has been handed down through the ages. From there, we examined several passages of Scripture and talked about how to engage in fruitful ecumenical dialogue. Thanks be to God, I was perfectly healthy for that session!

On March 25th, I will be hosting our third parish *Catechism 102* session. The topic will be Faith and Science/Reason. I hope to see you there—and if you have questions, please be sure to submit them in advance!

## Family Activity for Lent

- **Stations of the Cross** : Praying the Stations of the Cross (or Way of the Cross) as a family is a great way to introduce your kids to the story of Jesus' Passion. Find a family friendly version of the Stations if you have little ones, and walk the same path that Jesus walked for each of us.

## The Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (O.C.I.A.)

During the 11:00 a.m. Masses in March, we will have the joy of witnessing important liturgical rites that are part of our journey toward Easter. These include the Penitential Rite and the Scrutinies. What is a Scrutiny? It's a profound liturgical rite observed during Lent, which are essential steps for our OCIA catechumens and candidates as they prepare to fully enter the Church at the Easter Vigil. During the Scrutinies, the Church prays for these individuals to be freed from sin and strengthened in the face of temptation, inviting them to a deeper conversion and understanding of Jesus Christ as they prepare to fully join the Catholic Church.

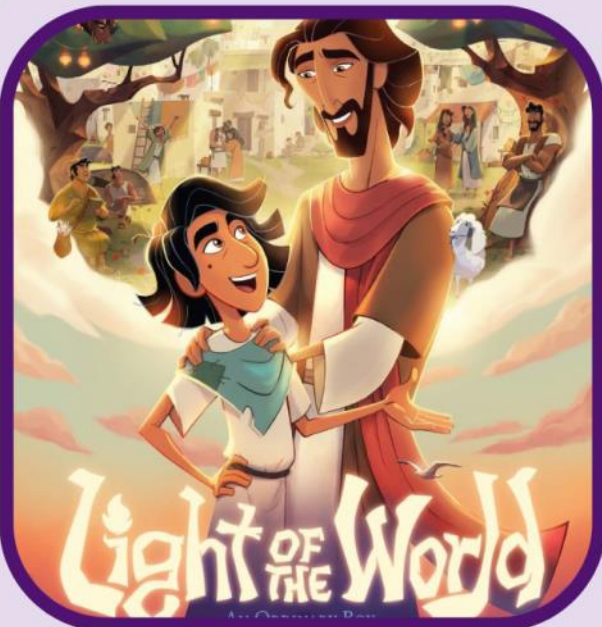
### March 8 — 1st Scrutiny

Readings: Exodus 17:3-7; Psalm 95; Romans 5:1-2, 5-8; John 4:5-42  
The First Scrutiny encourages the catechumens to come to God's living water, recognizing any obstacles in embracing Christ.

### March 15th — 2nd Scrutiny

Readings: 1 Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a; Psalm 23; Ephesians 5:8-14; John 9:1-41  
This Second Scrutiny invites the catechumens to turn away from spiritual blindness and embrace the light of Christ, acknowledging Jesus as the true healer and light of the world.

As a parish community, let's accompany our catechumens with our prayers and solidarity, witnessing their journey as a reminder of our own baptismal call to holiness. May these rites lead all of us to a deeper conversion and renewal as we prepare for Easter.

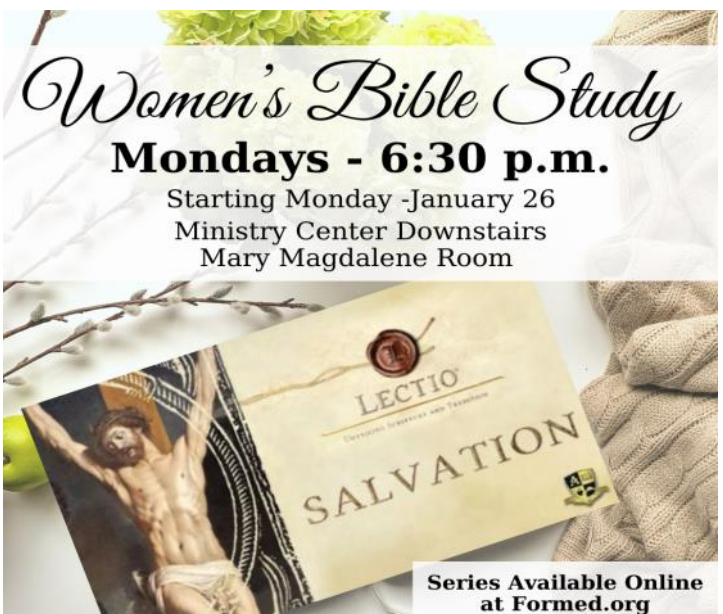
